PTA Business

Christine called the meeting to order at 7:02pm, and welcomed everyone.

Motion to enter the minutes from last meeting (Jan 2022) was made by Paula Currall, and seconded by Karen Rose.

Christine introduced Jed Barkin and Tyler Bannister from Headfirst Summer Camps.

Jed said that they are a proud/honoured gold sponsor of the OES PTA, and went on to introduce their camps.

- 26th season of summer camps 4th year at Flint Hill Oakton, VA
- Mission inspire the personal best in each kid
- There have been no covid cases at their Flint Hill location
- Discount for OES parents (for all programs) OES22 to save 10% when you enroll
- Their umbrella company also offers DC United soccer camps and Washington Nationals baseball/softball camps
- They offer a variety of camps for children 3 yrs old to rising 5th graders
- Before and After care (7:30am to camp; camp to 6:00pm)
- Capitol Hill bus to other camp locations
- Safety Update:
 - We don't know what the summer will look like, but we have plans/protocols in place
 - Will meet or exceed latest CDC guidelines
 - Some protocols from last summer included masking (staff at all times, kids inside), stagger car pool, smaller groups, etc
 - No vaccination mandate for campers; counsellors need to be vaccinated or submit to weekly testing
 - o They continue to monitor and will as they move forward
- Junior Day Camp (3 and 4 yrs old)

- o Provide the youngest with exposure to new topics/school readiness
- o Super 6 (
- Not school, but they are learning (content and skills how to listen, follow directions, transitions, etc)
- o Each week has a different theme projects/activities throughout the week will tie into the theme
- o Music, sports, art, STEM, etc.
- We have added back swim (OakMarr) this year twice per week or water play on non-pool days
- o Small ratios 2 buddies
- Day Camp (rising K 1st graders)
 - o Theme based curriculum
 - o Super 6
 - Also pool days (OakMarr) and water play
- Multi Sport program (rising K 5th graders)
 - Active program
 - o All levels
 - Variety in sport exposure to different sports and PE style games
 - o Wrist bands to go with the Super 6 qualities
- Innovators, Inc. (rising 2nd and 3rd graders) & STEM (rising 4th and 5th graders)
 - Field trips and expert workshops

Christine introduced a brief conversation about summer camps, and asked for recommendations.

Christine Lancman: *Vienna Day camps* – Registraton begins March 14th for non-town residents. They have tried and enjoyed the football and baseball camps, though they are half day camps.

Amy Gillard: *19 Multisport camp* – kids really enjoyed it; they have a nice program; mostly outside, but do have an indoor areas at Vienna Adventist when needed; approx. age for campers is 6-12 yrs; they don't expect any expertise in the sports.

Paula: *Camp Illahee* - sleepaway camp in NC; all girls; approx. 8hr drive; campillahee.com *Camp High Rocks* – sleepaway camp in NC; all boys; camphighrocks.com **Julie**: *Cuppett Performing Arts Center* – half-day day camp; Celebration of the Arts camp; small groups; zoom during covid; camps for younger kids too (art); Her daughter did the Pop Star week and made a t-shirt that she designed; there is a performance at the end of the week.

Meredith: *Harmonia Music Academy* in Vienna – 2 week musical theatre camp; all indoors; performance at the end of the 2 weeks.

Ice Skating camp at SkateQuest – mix of indoor and outdoor; 2 week sessions; small performance at the end of the session.
